 - Also include any other key information you found during your research of the group.
- 2) What current issues is your group concerned with?

Searching "Google News" will also help you find information on what issue(s) your interest group has been involved with most recently.

- What are some examples of some recent legislation your group supported or opposed?
- 3) What actions does your group take to try to influence policy and the public agenda? Give specific examples: (example use of the media, lawsuits (litigation), direct lobbying, public Information contributions, etc.)
- 4) Which parts of the government does your group target? (i.e. Executive branch departments and congressional committees)
- 5) What is the group's political ideology?

Does it favor one political party over the other? If so, does it have a history of supporting certain political candidates?
